Would you like to help develop an action health plan to address health and social issues for women after their release from prison?



Mo Korchiński (our research assistant) will invite you to participate in the research project at the Maple Ridge bus loop when you leave ACCW.

If you agree, she will ask you some questions about yourself and your health. This interview will take 30 min and you will receive an honorarium of \$20.



Mo will invite you to consent to be contacted every 3 months after you leave prison to do an interview and complete surveys.

You will be asked some questions about your health, education, job skills, family, support, housing and the nine health goals that women in prison have told us are important to them.



You will receive an honorarium of \$20 for each interview, which will take about an hour.

These interviews will be conducted by former inmates who are community-based peer researchers and who also work with Women into Healing.
